# **ECOS Plan Process (2011-2012)**

- 1. Goals distilled from 60 plans
- 2. Analysis increase understanding
- Indicators track progress towards achieving goals
- 4. Implementation Priorities identify concerns
- 5. Develop ECOS Plan (regional plan, MTP, CEDS) tie actions to strategic priorities
- 6. Monitoring annual report of indicators and accomplishments



# Plan Updates – Regional Plan

The Regional Plan is a document that protects the County's resources and guides its development - required by the State of Vermont.

### **Plan Updates - CEDS**

The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) document is a community-based undertaking to inventory economic development activities taking place within the county to better understand the ways in which our county is growing and where it may be headed..." – US Economic Development Administration requirement to apply for EDA grants

# **Plan Updates - MTP**

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan is a document that identifies the short- and long-term strategies, actions and projects that will lead to "an integrated multimodal transportation system to facilitate the safe and efficient movement of people and goods..." — required by USDOT to guide federal surface transportation funding investments

# Metropolitan Transportation Plan

- Describes vision for the region, and policies, operational strategies, and projects to achieve it
- Covers at least the next 20 years
- Leads to an intermodal system
- Reflects public involvement
- Contains a financial plan and is fiscally constrained
- Is updated every 5 years



#### Fiscal constraint and the MTP

- Include a financial plan demonstrating consistency with available and projected revenues
- Identify proposed new revenue sources and strategies to ensure their availability



#### **UPWP Overview**

- Summarizes CCRPC's planning activities and deliverables for each fiscal year (July 1 - June 30)
- Is a mechanism to implement the strategies for our region outlined in the ECOS Plan
- Helps municipalities to develop plans (transportation/land use/water quality), scoping of transportation facilities, and provides technical assistance, & other state grants and municipal planning requests.





#### **UPWP Schedule**

- Projects (scoping, corridor studies, etc.), technical assistance, transportation counts, TDM – solicited end of November to late January: Driven by member municipalities and partner organizations
- UPWP Committee reviews January to March
- FHWA/VTrans review for PL funds eligibility Feb
- Executive & Finance Committee & Board review April to May
- Board approves UPWP & Budget in May
- Work program starts July 1
- Mid-year review December

# Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- A staged, multi-year, intermodal program of prioritized transportation projects and transit capital consistent with Plan
- Shows annual activity for a 4-year period
- Contains a financial plan and is fiscally constrained
- An initiative not listed in the TIP cannot receive FHWA or FTA funds
- Reflects public involvement
- Must be updated at least every 4 years CCRPC updates every year

# An effective TIP development process...

- Is part of a multimodal planning process
- Represents sound financial planning
- Contains only those initiatives consistent with Long-Range Plan
- Reflects early consensus and early screening of proposed initiatives
- Results from technical and policy leader buy-in




#### Fiscal constraint and the TIP

- Financially constrained by year
- Demonstrates which projects can be implemented with current revenue sources
- Identifies strategies for ensuring the availability of new funding sources
