are proposing a zero percent increase and noted the last increase was in FY20 and dues were held

level in FY21. Based on the current fiscal climate and impacts of COVID, it is not necessary to ask for an increase for FY22. Members discussed. Charlie stated we typically raise dues every 3-5 years, and the level dues are not to be perceived as permanent. However, because of COVID-19, this is not the right time to raise dues. Members agreed.

BARD HILL MADE A MOTION, SECONDED BY ANDY MONTROLL TO KEEP THE DUES LEVEL FOR FY22. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

6. CCRPC'S FTA Title VI Program

Emma referred members to the FTA Title VI Program Memo and Federal Transit Administration Title VI Program Draft document included in the packet. She explained the CCRPC has had components of a Title VI Program available for many years (e.g., complaint procedures, complaint form, equity maps, etc.), however, these were not assembled in a formal FTA Title VI Program until this year. The FTA Title VI Program is different than the CCRPC's Annual Title VI report submitted to the Federal Highway Administration and VTrans, and those do not require Board approval. Regina clarified the report is due every three years. Bryan explained even though the requirement is every three years, we will likely gather and capture information on a more regular basis. We do compile an annual report to VTrans every year that outlines our work and public participation. Mike asked what role the CCRPC Board has in addressing a complaint? Emma explained this is handled by the Executive Director, however, the Executive Committee would review if it was related to the Executive Director. Mike asked how the board is apprised of these issues? Members discussed. Charlie noted that the document currently provides for an appeal to VTrans if someone is dissatisfied with the Executive Director's determination. Mike requested the Executive Committee be notified of any complaints. Members agreed. Charlie suggested that this edit as well as an edit to notify the Executive Committee about the conclusion of the complaint process be added.

JOHN ZICCONI MADE A MOTION, SECONDED BY ANDY MONTROLL TO RECOMMEND BOARD APPROVAL OF THE FTA TITLE VI PROGRAM DRAFT WITH REQUESTED EDITS. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

7. Chair/Executive Director Report

a. Organizational Update; COVID and Finances. Charlie explained not much has changed regarding office use due to COVID. Staff continues to work mostly from home and is at the office infrequently. Although remote work procedures were implemented quickly, in terms of processing invoices and payables, it is going very well. Charlie said financially, there has not been any report of changes to funding and budgets, however, FY22 could be concerning. Mike asked if there is still interest from CATMA in sharing office space. Charlie is not sure, but he will check. Charlie said meetings continue to be virtual, but in the future, we are looking to create a hybrid model, that incorporates in-person with video participation. Regina noted the feeling of virtual meetings is very different from holding in-person meetings; discussions are missing the element of personal interaction and are not as lively. Members agreed.

b. <u>Legislative Update</u>: Charlie noted that the Legislature and Governor made the FY21 budget work, but that FY22 will be more challenging. A narrowed down version of the ACT 250 bill was passed; Governor Scott will likely veto this. Charlie expects this to be a topic in the next session. Charlie said Housing Bill S237 will become law and the Climate Change Bill has also become law after overriding the Governor's veto. Regina stated the Marijuana bill may have land use implications and is likely to become law.

c. <u>Clean Water Service Provider Update</u>: Charlie explained the DEC has been very open with sharing draft version of the rules. Regina attended a Clean Water Advisory Committee meeting yesterday and said they are not yet at the stage of formal rulemaking. Regina said Dan asked that comments from the CWAC be submitted before Friday, however, for the most part, the draft appears to be in pretty good shape. Charlie said the DEC is very concerned about the conflict of interest with the council and conversations around this are taking place with DEC now, as they are developing the rules and regulations.

Charlie reminded everyone he is continuing to present our annual reports to municipalities; he wanted to pass along credit and praise to staff for the services being provided. He said the towns he has met with to date have all expressed appreciation and thanks to the CCRPC staff for the great work and support being provided.

8. Draft CCRPC Board Meeting Agenda

Charlie reviewed the October Board Meeting Agenda with members. Charlie said he will confirm Secretary Joe Flynn will join the meeting. Members discussed the proposed agenda including, the FTA Title VI Program, an Interstate-89 Study update, discussion of the Legislative Breakfast and Annual Dues. Charlie said the Legislative Breakfast will be held virtually the second week of December. He is wondering if our virtual meeting platforms allow breakout sessions with smaller groups to facilitate conversations and networking. Emma said yes, we can offer options to hold smaller breakout sessions within larger virtual meetings. Charlie asked EC and Board members to think about whether we should have breakouts and whether they should be by topic or by municipality. Bard asked if VTrans could be asked to provide towns notice of road work and maintenance before the work occurs. Eleni agreed to contact them.

Income Statement through September 2020

We are off to a relatively strong start for FY21. The first quarter doesn't usually generate a surplus of revenues. However, while staff did use some time off during the summer months as is typical, it appears that there is more project billing in the first quarter than we usually experience. The direct project billing (consultants) is "normal" for the first quarter of the fiscal year. COVID has depressed consultant work somewhat, but the levels are similar to the start of FY20.

Expenses are less than the budget year, with some of the expense lines that are associated with "non-COVID" times barely moving the needle. I'm referring to Conferences, Program Workshops, and Mileage.

Cash Flow through September 2020

We were able to generate a positive cash balance for the year in FY20. We started FY21 with typical cash balances, and then began collecting municipal dues and an ACCD quarterly payment, in addition to our regular project billing. The cash picture looks healthy currently.

Chittenden County Regional Planning Commission (CCRPC) has received the 45-day notice of a Section 248 Petition to be filed with the Vermont Public Utility Commission for a 2.2 MW solar project on Lake Road in Charlotte, VT. CCRPC has reviewed this project's conformance with CCRPC's 2018 Chittenden County ECOS Plan, which gained a Determination of Energy Compliance from the Vermont Department of Public Service on August 9, 2018.

ECOS Energy Goal

CCRPC finds that this project meets the intent of the Energy Goal (Goal #17) of the 2018 ECOS Plan: "Move Chittenden County's energy system toward a cleaner, more efficient and renewable system that benefits health, economic development, and the local/global climate by working towards the State's Comprehensive Energy Plan goals."

Strategy 2, Action 4b of the ECOS Plan states "CCRPC supports the generation of new renewable energy in the County to meet the Vermont Comprehensive Energy Plan's goals of using 90% renewable energy by 2050, in a manner that is cost effective and respects the natural environment." Development of the proposed solar facility would implement this action.

The Plan's suitability policies help determine whether projects are cost effective and the Plan's constraint policies help determine whether projects respect the natural environment:

Suitability Policies

The 2018 ECOS Plan recommends the location of renewable energy generation facilities in appropriate locations, as defined by the polices in Strategy 2, Action 4b. Inability to meet these guidelines does not necessarily preclude the ability to develop renewable energy generation development. While the project as proposed meets one of the suitability policies:

The project is outside of any state designated centers or historic districts.

With a modification the proposal could meet a second suitability criteria: Locate energy generation proximate to existing distribution and transmission infrastructure with adequate capacity and near areas with high electric load. CCRPC suggests that the petitioner work with the adjacent landowner to the south, the Vermont Agency of Transportation, to determine if future interconnection could be extended

directly to the existing Green Mountain Power substation located to the south of the project site. Interconnecting via this route would be a shorter geographic distance than the proposed interconnection.

Constraints Policies

The 2018 ECOS Plan states that development should be located to avoid state and local known constraints that have been field verified, and to minimize impacts to state and local possible constraints that have been field verified (Strategy 3, Action 1.f and Strategy 4, Action 1.f and Action 2.e). We've identified a number of constraints in our review and are therefore asking for further information before determining whether this project as proposed is in conformance with the Regional Plan.

Our review indicates that the following state known constraints may be impacted by the project:

- <u>River Corridors</u>: Part of the proposed access road is possibly located within a River Corridor along Pringle Brook. CCRPC requests that the full petition confirm that no new infrastructure will be located within the River Corridor; unless approval is received from the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources.
- <u>State-significant natural communities and rare, threatened and endangered species:</u>
 Information from the Agency Natural Resources indicates the possible location of existence of a rare, threatened, or endangered species near the southeast corner of the property. CCRPC requests that the petitioner identify the existence, or not, of rare, threatened, or endangered species in the full petition. If this constraint exists on site, the full petition should confirm that no new infrastructure will impact this constraint; unless approval is received from the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources.</u>
- <u>Class 1 and 2 wetlands:</u> The proposed access road may impact a Class 2 wetland and part of the
 proposed facility may be located within a Class 2 wetland buffer. CCRPC requests that the
 wetlands be delineated by a qualified professional and wetland boundaries be shown in the full
 petition. If wetlands exist on site, the full petition should confirm that no new infrastructure
 will impact the wetlands; unless approval is received from the Vermont Agency of Natural
 Resources.

Our review indicates that the following state possible constraints may be impacted by the project:

• <u>Agricultural Soils and Hydric Soils:</u> The proposed facility is located on an area composed of prime and statewide agricultural soils. CCRPC requests that impacts to these soils be minimized in accordance with the recommendations of the Vermont Agency of Agriculture.

Our review indicates that the following local possible constraints may be impacted by the project:

- Surface Water, Wetlands, and Buffer Areas: The proposed access driveway may impact Pringle Brook and a Class 2 wetland. Another part of the proposed facility may be located within a Class 2 wetland buffer. As stated above, CCRPC requests that the wetlands be delineated by a qualified professional and wetland boundaries be shown in the full petition. If wetlands exist on site, CCRPC recommends that impacts to these wetlands be minimized. CCRPC also recommends that the petitioner work with the Town of Charlotte to determine if the access drive to the project site can be constructed in a manner that minimizes potential impacts to this constraint and complies with the Town of Charlotte Road and Driveway Standard.
- <u>Wildlife Habitat:</u> The proposed access road and facility may be located within an area designated as "wildlife" habitat in the Charlotte Town Plan (Map 6). Please confirm the

- project's location in regard to this resource in the full petition. CCRPC requests that impacts to this habitat be minimized.
- <u>Land in Active Agriculture:</u> The parcel is actively being farmed. Development of the parcel to a solar facility would likely remove the parcel from agricultural production. Please provide more information about how impacts to this constraint may be mitigated in the full petition.
- <u>Scenic Views</u>: CCRPC requests further information regarding the visibility of this project along Greenbush Road in the full petition. Greenbush Road is identified in the Charlotte Town Plan as a Scenic Road; and impacts to this viewshed should be minimized.

These comments are based on information currently available; CCRPC will review the full petition before making a final decision regarding the project's conformance with the ECOS Plan and both the suitability and constraints policies.

1. Clean Water (2019 Act 76, S.96)

Act 76, the 2019 Clean Water Bill that was the brainchild of the Agency of Natural Resources (ANR), establishes a new structure for improving water quality throughout Vermont. It should also better achieve the clean water goals established in total maximum daily load (TMDL) plans that have been approved by the federal Environmental Protection Agency. The concept is to devolve responsibility for administering non-regulatory clean water programs to entities other than ANR, which is not well suited to implementing them. CCRPC applied to be the Clean Water Service Provider for the Direct to Lake Basin in May, 2020. There will be rulemaking to address the specifics of how the Clean Water Service Providers will operate. CCRPC will remain heavily involved in this process.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: CCRPC Staff recommends that we continue to work with the CWAC to provide comments on Clean Water Service Provider rules and funding.

2. Testing of Autonomous Vehicles (2019 Act 60, S.149)

Act 60 includes Vermont's first attempt to address the testing of automated vehicles traveling state roads and creates a new section of law, the Automated Vehicles Testing Act. The rules are out for public comment at this time. Once the rules are established, municipal legislative bodies can opt to have their Class 2 and 3 roads used for testing. CCRPC will continue to provide the TAC with this information, and talk with legislative bodies as requested.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: Staff recommends that CCRPC work with both the TAC and directly with municipalities to decide whether they would like to pre-approve automated vehicle testing on their roads.

3. Promoting the Ownership and Use of Electric Vehicles

FY2021 Transportation Bill – H 942 - https://legislature.vermont.gov/bill/status/2020/H.942

- Includes \$750,000 for continuing State funding for EV charging.
- Ongoing support for State EV incentive program to continue spending down funds appropriated last session. Placeholder to add more funds to the program if federal COVID relief funds are available to support other critical transportation infrastructure investments. We may not know for several months whether additional funds are likely.
- Draft bill includes study for manufacturer direct vehicle sales and service, which could lead to a proposal that would allow Tesla, Rivian and other EV manufacturers to operate service centers in Vermont.
- The original bill called for a pilot EV fee program to work with the PUC and electric utilities on a per kWh fee similar to a gasoline tax on EV use. This is removed in the current version of the bill as it was not deemed critical after COVID-related disruptions.
- This is related to an ongoing VT PUC investigation on EV fees that stemmed from the FY19 investigation (#18-2660-INV):

Energy Efficiency Modernization Act – S 337 - https://legislature.vermont.gov/bill/status/2020/S.337

- Would allow Efficiency Vermont and Burlington Electric Dept to expand electric efficiency program spending to include transportation and thermal programs. Could provide additional support for EV dealer engagement, consumer education, and other activities to be determined through a stakeholder engagement process.
- Bill under consideration could provide up to \$2 million per year for three years (2021-2023) on these types of programs.
- Related to ongoing VT PUC investigation that informed legislative deliberations and may continue to support implementation if the bill passes:

Building Energy Code: The new code will be in effect as of 9/1/2020. This new code includes provisions for electric vehicles in the base code and more stringent requirements for EVs in the stretch code. Here is the webpage with more details: https://publicservice.vermont.gov/content/building-energy-standards-update.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: Staff recommends that CCRPC continue to monitor legislation and policies related to EVs and comment as necessary. Staff also recommends that CCRPC continue its longstanding work with Drive Electric Vermont.

4. VTrans' Project Selection & Prioritization Processes

VTrans is in the process of updating its project selection and prioritization processes. They are seeking to improve the performance-based and data driven project selection and prioritization framework. They intend to review/revamp/revise the current processes to: identify and define how ideas for transportation improvements can become transportation projects; and, take advantage of "harmonization" opportunities to address transportation needs to deliver increased value through our transportation projects. VTrans has been seeking RPC input throughout the process. Christine has been serving on the technical advisory committee.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: Continue to assist VTrans in this effort and bring drafts to the TAC and Board for review.

5. Transportation Climate Initiative

The <u>Transportation and Climate Initiative</u> (TCI) is a regional collaboration of 12 Northeast and Mid-Atlantic states and the District of Columbia that seeks to improve transportation, develop the clean energy economy and reduce carbon emissions from the transportation sector. The participating states are: Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Virginia.

Recognizing that more than one third of all carbon emissions come from the transportation sector, participating states started taking action through working groups focused on regional priorities, such as <u>clean vehicles and fuels</u>. Several TCI states are also now working together to explore potential regional policies to improve transportation systems and reduce pollution.

In Vermont, ANR and VTrans are working together on this initiative. CCRPC assisted by supporting regional workshops to discuss rural transportation options in the Fall of 2019.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: Staff recommends continuing to support this work as it directly ties into our transportation and energy work.

6. Rail Service Study

As we know from the media, several years ago AllEarth Rail acquired low cost diesel mobile unit passenger rail cars. It is now time to have a planning process to determine if it is financially feasible to operate passenger rail service in Northwestern Vermont without significant public subsidies. We applied for a USDOT BUILD planning grant to explore the feasibility of this service in 2019 that was not funded. We will continue to apply for federal funding and seek private sector matching funds to fund a feasibility study. The concept would rely heavily on developing properties adjacent to the rail stations and using that revenue to support the rail service. One possible site that may be explored for redevelopment is the Burlington Railyard, so this study will also examine opportunities to relocate the Railyard. A large, public planning process will be necessary to explore the concept, determine public and municipal support, and determine fiscal feasibility.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: This work ties directly into our transportation, land use, and energy work so we recommend supporting the effort by managing a federal planning grant, if awarded.

7. Act 250 Reform (H.962) and Housing Bill (S.237)

UPDATE NOVEMBER 2020:

H.926 – a minimal Act 250 bill was passed by the Legislature in September. This bill was vetoed by the Governor. The bill did not include Act 250 exemptions for Downtowns and Neighborhood Development Areas, which were critical to CCRPC for a balanced approach to Act 250 reform. It is expected that Act 250 reform will be discussed again in the 2021 session.

S.237 – the Housing bill, as passed by the Legislature in September, includes amendments to Accessory Dwelling Units, existing small lots and does not allow multi-family dwellings to be denied based on character of area in conditional use review. The bill also grants municipalities the authority to regulate short-term rentals. There is an issue with the provision on restricting private covenants; many agree a technical correction will be needed in the next legislative session.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: CCRPC has been working with our municipalities and regional partners on the Act 250 reform effort for the past three years. CCRPC Staff recommends that we continue in this work in line with ECOS Plan Strategy #2; and Top 10 Action #1. CCRPC Staff also recommend that we assist with the technical correction to S.237 if needed; and help municipalities implement the changes required from this bill.

8. Broadband Deployment throughout Vermont (H.513)

Excerpt from VLCT's 2019 Legislative Wrap-up

"Reaching the last mile," says the Findings section in the as-passed version of H.513, "will require a grassroots approach that is founded on input from and support of local communities, whose residents are best situated to decide which broadband solution fits their needs. ... As we expand our access and reliance on the Internet, we need to be intentional in supporting rural communities and town centers." The Connectivity Initiative (of 2018) is now designed to provide internet service to each address in Vermont that has a speed of at least 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload. With COVID-19 there has been an increased effort to expand broadband in the state, including a couple of new bills. CCRPC will assist as requested in ensuring broadband expansion in the region.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: While there is no direct role for CCRPC in the 2019 bill, CCRPC will assist in the latest expansion efforts as requested.

9. Climate Change – Global Warming Solutions

UPDATE NOVEMBER 2020:

H.688 of 2020 (Act 153), known as the Vermont Global Warming Solutions Act of 2020, creates the ability for a citizen to sue the state if it fails to reduce greenhouse gas pollution to 26% below 2005 levels by 2025, to 40% below 1990 levels by 2030, and 80% below by 2050. The legislation creates a council facilitated by the Agency of Natural Resources charged with developing a plan to meet the milestones outlined above. The Governor's veto was overridden.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: Staff recommends that CCRPC monitor and participate in implementation of this bill.

10. Proposed Changes to Vermont's Net Metering Rules (PUC Case 19-0855-RULE)

The Public Utilities Commission began an investigation regarding the biennial update of Vermont's net metering rules in March 2019. The net metering rules cover a number of topics, including electric rates, grid constraints, caps on renewable energy utilities by individuals and businesses, and siting. Siting issues, particularly the definition of "preferred sites" for net metering solar and wind facilities, are an important component of energy planning work at the regional and local level. VAPDA provided comments on this in the Fall of 2019; and it appears that the case is still open.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: Staff recommends that CCRPC continue to monitor and participate in this rulemaking process, with a particular focus on the issue of preferred sites. Energy siting on preferred sites is highly encouraged in the ECOS Plan and it is important that these sites remain viable for energy development. ADDED NOVEMBER 2020: CCRPC should also monitor caps on renewable energy generation to ensure these projects are not hindered, and Act 153 can be achieved.

11. Community Justice Center Regional Workshop

Our municipalities that manage Community Justice Centers and the Vermont Department of Corrections asked us to host a regional workshop in Fall 2019 to discuss service models, staffing and work distribution need to be evaluated from a region-wide standpoint to determine a financially

sustainable model.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: We recommend supporting the effort by continuing to follow-up on the regional workshop held in the Fall of 2019 and develop options for all parties this summer with a final workshop in Fall 2020.

12. Chittenden Accountable Community for Health (CACH (ACO))

Vermont continues to move forward with implementing an accountable care organizational structure for health care that will shift the focus more towards public health initiatives. Some of this work will intersect with our work in the areas of developing walkable communities and transportation services (especially for elderly and disabled). Staff has been monitoring this effort and providing some level of assistance as they work to develop a functional organizational structure. We helped the Chittenden County Opioid Alliance evolve into the Chittenden County Population Health Alliance in early 2020 to foster this work.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: We recommend continuing engagement as needed to make sure municipal interests are represented in the work of the Population Health Alliance.

13. Climate Change Response Plan – Public Health

S.185 of 2020 proposes to require the Department of Health to develop and adopt a statewide climate change response plan. It further proposes to require regional planning commissions to develop a communications plan for the purpose of mitigating and responding to climate change related public health risks. This bill passed the Senate on 5/19/2020.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: We recommend continuing engagement as needed on the bill itself, and continue to work with our public health partners on this work in the future.

14. Cannabis taxation and regulation (S.54)

UPDATE NOVEMBER 2020:

<u>S.54 (Act 164)</u> – Cannabis Tax and Regulate – became law on October 7th, and will become fully effective in 2022. The new tax and regulatory system is still a work in progress, with responsibility for some details left to the new Cannabis Control Board, which will be formed in 2021. Here are some key points, adapted from the Vermont League of Cities & Towns (VLCT) summary:

- Retail sales will only be allowed in communities that vote to opt-in.
- Cultivation, testing, warehousing, and distribution are not subject to any municipal opt-in.
- While municipalities cannot issue blanket prohibitions of cannabis establishments via ordinance or zoning, the uses are subject to zoning. The bill empowers communities to create local cannabis control commissions, and for such commissions to condition issuance of a local license on any zoning bylaw adopted pursuant to 24 V.S.A, section 4414.

- Per <u>VLCT's interpretation</u>, municipalities can make cannabis establishments subject to conditional use review/approval, and perhaps even craft new conditional use review standards pursuant to 24 VSA, section 4414(3)(B)(v).
- Cannabis shall not be regulated as "farming," and cultivated cannabis shall not be considered an agricultural product or agricultural crop under relevant State laws; therefore municipalities will have the power to regulate cannabis cultivation through zoning, unlike traditional agricultural practices and agricultural structures.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: CCRPC will be working with the Planning Advisory Committee on the relevant components of this bill as more details are worked out.

16. Project Specific TIF (2020 H.642)

House bill 642 proposes to allow a municipality to use tax increment financing to develop a project. The intention is to simplify the process and program for small infrastructure projects in rural communities like municipal wastewater. It was introduced in January 2020, but hasn't moved.

Staff Recommendation to the CCRPC Board: Staff recommends that CCRPC monitor and support this bill if it moves.
